As you are aware certain people have been stating that Invesco (owner of Williams Tower) does not support the Post Oak Boulevard Dedicated Bus Lanes Project.

I contacted Invesco today, Monday, January 26, 2014 and they have confirmed that they in fact support the Project. I spoke directly with Meredith Cress, Senior Property Manager for Williams Tower. She has been in direct communications with the Invesco Asset Manager and confirmed their support of the Project. Invesco agrees that there is an issue with traffic on Post Oak, but has not stated it is in agreement with the bus lanes as a solution. Hines before the ownership change of Williams Tower supported the bus lane program from what I have been told. I expressed to John Breeding at his office on June 29th that we were not on board at that time with the project as a solution to the traffic congestion. To date we have not been copied on any consultant reports prepared by a third party supporting the project. I also mentioned that bus service to the Post Oak area that has been eliminated due to a lack of ridership but did not receive an acceptable response. The bus lane project is still under review within our group.
