MOTION FOR TRANSFER OF VENUE

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT

COMES NOW, Defendant KEVIN HENRY, and files this Motion for Transfer of Venue and will show onto this Honorable Court as follows:

I. SUMMARY OF THE MOTION

Kevin Henry cannot be afforded an impartial trial in Brazoria County, Texas. There exists a combination against Kevin Henry instigated by influential persons, by reason of which he cannot expect a fair an impartial trial and an impartial trial cannot be had in Brazoria County. As such, Henry moves this court for mandatory transfer of venue.

II. FACTUAL AND PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

1. Defendant Henry's accuser - Plaintiff, Derrick Dees – is a *very* well-connected member of Brazoria County. Among many other things, Dees is a businessman, lifelong Brazoria County resident, and husband to the current Brazoria County Treasurer, Angela Dees. In addition to being a well-known Brazoria County Resident, Dees is also, by his own admission, "long time friends with Brazoria County Sheriff Bo Stallman." (*See* Plaintiff's Corrected Petition).

- 2. Defendant Henry ran for Sheriff against Bo Stallman in a very adversarial election that caught the attention of the entire county. Defendant is also the host of "The Kevin Henry Podcast," a podcast that seeks to dive "deep into the murky waters of corruption in Brazoria County," "exposing the twisted ties between power and greed that threaten our communities," and "shine a light on the dark corners of local governance, holding the powerful accountable and giving a voice to the voiceless." (*See* Exhibit A).
- 3. Defendant been particularly vocal about some of the allegations made against Brazoria County Sheriff Bo Stallman's and has discussed these actions and this behavior at length on his podcast and its platforms. Defendant has also discussed concerns about those connected politically and otherwise with Sheriff Stallman.
- 4. After voicing these concerns publicly, through his podcast and its platforms, Defendant was sued by Plaintiff very well-connected resident of Brazoria County and lifelong friend of Sheriff Stallman. Plaintiff has sued Defendant for libel, libel per se, slander, slander per se, and conspiracy citing predominantly, a political campaign in which Plaintiff was not an electoral candidate at issue but his good buddy, Sheriff Stallman, was.
- 5. Since its inception, this litigation has proved to be biased and prejudicial in an unprecedented manner toward Mr. Henry. The same day that Plaintiff's Original Petition was filed, an *ex-parte* Temporary Restraining Order was issued by Judge Jessica Pulcher, who was sitting ancillary. (*See* Temporary Restraining Order and Order Setting Hearing for Temporary Injunction).
- 6. This <u>ex-parte</u> Temporary Restraining Order "found" that complained of statements made by Defendant Henry were both false and defamatory statements. It is important to note that at the time the TRO was issued, Defendant Henry had not been afforded any opportunity to present

even a single piece of evidence or a single word of testimony to the Court. Yet somehow, without hearing from Defendant Henry, the Court signed an order riddled with catastrophically prejudicial "findings," that violated a myriad of Defendant Henry's fundamental rights under both the United States and Texas Constitutions.

- 7. Moreover, at a show cause hearing held on September 23, 2025, Defendant Henry was accused of violating the Court's temporary restraining order by failing to delete two Facebook posts. One of the posts had been on Defendant Henry's Facebook page for more than five months and did not identify Plaintiff Dees by name or otherwise, and the other post, while mentioning Plaintiff Dees, was on Defendant Henry's Facebook page for less than two weeks. At the time of the hearing, Defendant Henry had deleted the posts in fact, the posts were deleted almost as soon as Defendant Henry retained the undersigned counsel.
- 8. Despite this perfectly reasonable explanation, and the removal of the posts at the time of his hearing, this Court punished Defendant Henry to an exceptionally extreme degree, sentencing Defendant Henry to thirty (30) days confinement in the Brazoria County Jail to be served <u>day for day</u> no enhanced credit for days served, no deferment of even a single day, absolutely no mercy. Defendant Henry was given a jail sentence that was two weeks longer than one of the posts had even been on the internet.
- 9. To make matters somehow more egregious, Defendant Henry was remanded to the custody of the Brazoria County Sheriff's Office an agency headed up by Sheriff Bo Stallman the very man that Defendant Henry has been so vocally critical of and it is that criticism that forms the basis of this lawsuit.
- 10. On September 26, 2025, the Court of Appeals for the First District of Texas at Houston granted Defendant Henry's Emergency Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus, stating that

"because we are of the tentative opinion that that relator is entitled to the legal relief sought or that a serious question concerning that relief requires further consideration, we grant relator's emergency request for release from custody." (See Exhibit B).

- 11. Under the excessive sentence imposed by this Court a punishment ordered because Defendant did not delete social media posts as quickly as Plaintiff Dees wanted them deleted Defendant Kevin Henry would <u>still</u> be confined in the Brazoria County Jail if the First Court of Appeals had not intervened.
- 12. The appellate proceeding in which the First Court of Appeals will determine whether or not this Court violated of Kevin Henry's due process rights under both the Texas and U.S. Constitutions as well as the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure is still pending.
- 13. To further the bias and prejudice that Defendant Henry faces if this case remains in Brazoria County, it is important to note that the local newspaper, *The Facts*, has published more than thirty (30) articles about Defendant Henry. (*See* Exhibit C).
- 14. It has become abundantly clear that Brazoria County is not an impartial venue and that transfer of venue is both proper and necessary, and the community of Brazoria tends to agree. With ten (10) supporting affidavits and one unsworn declaration, Defendant Kevin Henry will show to this court that an impartial trial is impossible and a failure to issue a transfer of venue would be a manifest injustice.

II. ARGUMENT AND AUTHORITIES

Under TEX. CIV. PRAC. REM. CODE § 15.063, the Court, on motion filed and served concurrently with or before the filing of the answer, shall transfer an action to another county of proper venue if... "an impartial trial cannot be had in the county in which the action is pending."

Pursuant to TEX. R. CIV. P. 257 a change in venue may be granted in civil cases upon

motion of either party, supported by his own affidavit and the affidavit of at least three credible persons residence of the county in which the suit is pending, for any following cause:

- (a) That there exists in the county where the suit is pending so great a prejudice against him that he cannot obtain a fair and impartial trial;
- (b) That there is a combination against him instigated by influential persons, by reason of which he cannot expect a fair and impartial trial;
- (c) That an impartial trial cannot be had in the county where the action is pending;
- (d) For other sufficient cause to be determined by the court.

Under TEX. R. CIV. P. 259, if a motion under TEX. R. CIV. P. 257 is granted, the cause shall be removed from "(d)(2)... a county court, to any adjoining county or to any district court where an impartial trial can be had."

A. The Statutorily Required Number of Affidavits have Been Provided

Pursuant to Tex. R. Civ. P. 257, a motion to transfer of venue must be supported by a mere three (3) affidavits along with the affidavit of the movant. Attached to this motion and incorporated herein by reference, are ten (10) sworn affidavits and one unsworn declaration of prominent and tenured residents of Brazoria County, as well as an affidavit from Defendant Henry himself. The affidavits are hereby identified below:

- 1. Affidavit of Brad Caudle (See Exhibit F)
- 2. Affidavit of Kristen Blackett (See Exhibit G)
- 3. Affidavit of Amy Gregory (See Exhibit H)
- 4. Affidavit of Joyce Peltier (See Exhibit I)
- 5. Affidavit of Tonie Meyer (See Exhibit J)
- 6. Affidavit of Pam Stuckey (See Exhibit K)
- 7. Affidavit of Chris Buchanan (See Exhibit L)

- 8. Affidavit of Janice Stahl (See Exhibit M)
- 9. Affidavit of Micheal Stroman (See Exhibit N)
- 10. Unsworn Declaration of Jay Grimes (See Exhibit O)
- 11. Affidavit of J.R. Beadel (See Exhibit P)
- 12. Affidavit of Kevin Henry (See Exhibit Q)

Each and every one of these twelve affidavits state that Defendant Henry will not have access to an impartial trial should these proceedings remain in Brazoria County. Each and every one of these twelve affidavits state the affiant's personal belief (as well as providing support for that belief) that there is a combination against Kevin Henry instigated by influential persons, by reason of which he cannot expect a fair an impartial trial.

The affiants of the attached affidavits include, but are not limited to:

- a. Brad Caudle, the current Chief of Police of the Sweeny Police Department;
- b. Amy Gregory, a lifelong Brazoria County resident, contractor, and head of a non-profit;
- d. Joyce Peltier, a longtime Brazoria County resident and mother to a tenured Brazoria County law enforcement officer;
- e. Tonie Meyer, fifty (50) year Brazoria County resident and wife to a long time Angleton police officer;
- f. Micheal Stroman, a lifelong Brazoria County resident, previous Angleton Police Department employee, and current Trustee of the Angleton Independent School District;
- g. Chris Buchanan, lifelong Brazoria County resident, business owner, and volunteer youth counselor; and
- h. Janice Stahl, Brazoria County resident and non-profit founder.

In addition, the sworn affidavits of prominent and well tenured residents of the Brazoria County community, this motion also incorporates the Sworn Affidavit of Kevin Henry where in Defendant Henry details his concerns about his inability to obtain a fair and impartial trial in Brazoria County.

B. An Impartial Trial Cannot Be Had in Brazoria County

All eleven (10) affiants and one unsworn declarant state that they unequivocally belief that Kevin Henry would not have access to a fair and impartial trial should these proceedings remain in Brazoria County. First and foremost, Kevin Henry is a dissenting voice against elected officials in the Brazoria County community. Henry has "continued to be very outspoken on what he believes to be corruption in Brazoria County." (See Exhibit F). Moreover, Henry has spoken out on "Alleged misconduct by Sheriff Bo Stallman, including an incident involving an inappropriate exposure to a nurse" as well as "claims of election interference involving Sha[y]ne Green, Brazoria County Republican Chair." See Exhibit P). It is important to note that Judge Greg Hill, Sheriff Bo Stallman, and Derrick Dees are all members of the Brazoria County Republican Party.

Secondly, it has been made clear by the actions attested to in the affidavits that there is a clear campaign to discredit dissenting voices (like Kevin Henry's) in Brazoria County. One of the affiants notes that, "The Facts newspaper has published more than 20 articles that appear to target Mr. Henry. These pieces often lack balanced context and reinforce narratives aligned with the officials and institutions Mr. Henry has exposed." (See Exhibit P). Moreover, that same affiant, has also personally observed instances where "Civic leaders, including Chamber of Commerce affiliates and local club officials... echoe[d] partisan messaging and undermined Mr. Henry's credibility," and attests to instances where "Donors and political supporters" have "exerted pressure on elected officials" to be "hostile toward Mr. Henry." A local nonprofit leader, Janice Stahl, notes that, "certain religious leaders have discouraged their congregations from supporting certain candidates or whistleblowers like Mr. Henry," and emphasizes that "Civic organizations,

including local clubs and business associations, have echoed political messaging that discredits Mr. Henry's reporting and isolates those who support him." (See Exhibit M). This influence impairs the ability of any trier of fact in Brazoria County to remain impartial, with Janice Stahl noting, "These groups hold significant sway over community narratives, and their coordinated messaging has contributed to a climate of fear, conformity, and retaliation." (See Exhibit M). Other affiants' opinions are generally consistent with this narrative. Sweeney Police Department Chief of Police Brad Caudle notes in his affidavit that Henry is "generally disliked by people in the Brazoria County Judicial System" and Caudle "knew it would be disadvantageous to the Sweeny Police department for me to publicly associate with Kevin Henry." (See Exhibit F). Another affiant notes, there have been hateful comments made on social media toward Mr. Henry "to the tune of calling Defendant 'fake' and a 'joke'". (See Exhibit H).

This lack of impartiality goes beyond mere conversations and political pressures. One affiant discusses when the Brazoria County Republican Party passed "Resolution 2021-R-2, which explicitly which explicitly discourages support for dissenting voices and threatens censure for those who do." (*See* Exhibit O). While Mr. Henry was not named explicitly in this resolution, one can reasonably conclude based on the context of Mr. Henry's podcast, the content therein, and the lived experience of multiple affiants, that this resolution was clearly directed at Mr. Henry and his supporters. Even if one could not reach that conclusion, this resolution's existence, in concert with Mr. Henry's active dissent creates a hostile environment wherein it is nearly impossible for any factfinder to be remain untainted in the event of a trial.

For the foregoing reasons, it is clear that an impartial trial cannot be held in Brazoria County.

C. <u>A combination exists against Kevin Henry instigated by influential persons, by reason</u> of which he cannot expect a fair and impartial trial.

By their own admission, Plaintiff Derrick Dees and his wife, Brazoria County Treasurer Angela Dees, are well-connected members of their community. In Plaintiff's Original Petition, Plaintiff describes himself and his immediate family as "long-time, upstanding members of the local community." Dees notes that he founded and served as the Vice President of the Angleton Revitalization Committee, supports the rotary club and the FFA, and "considers attending local fundraisers to be his main social scene."

Plaintiff's wife, Angela Dees, CIO, was elected as the Brazoria County Treasurer in November 2022. The website of the Brazoria County Treasurer touts Angela Dees accolades, noting that in addition to being a lifelong resident of Brazoria County, she has served as "Chairman of the Board for the Greater Angleton Chamber of Commerce, Non-Executive Treasurer for the Brazoria County Fair Association, and Treasurer for the Brazoria County A&M Club." (*See* Exhibit D). In 2017 as a "Facts Leader Under 40 for her community involvement, philanthropy work, and part in revitalization of downtown Angleton."

Plaintiff Dees also holds himself out to be "long-time friends" with Brazoria County's top elected law enforcement official, Sheriff Bo Stallman. Sheriff Stallman has confirmed that he and Derrick Dees have been friends since high school. It is this friendship, and many others (that Plaintiff Dees does not detail in his petition), that establish that there is a combination against Defendant Kevin Henry, instigated by influential persons, by reason of which Kevin Henry cannot get a fair and impartial trial in Brazoria County. In discussing this "combination," multiple affiants name Sheriff Stallman, Derrick and Angela Dees, and Judge Greg Hill as the influential persons who have instigated said combination. (*See* Exhibit F, I, and J).

Nearly all of the twelve (12) affidavits attached to this motion detail the connections between the current regime of Brazoria County elected officials and/or discuss the "Good Ol' Boys" club or system that appears to be running rampant in Brazoria County. In this discussion of the connections between Brazoria County elected officials, the affiants cite specific instances of "Good Ol' Boys" club behavior/quid pro quo conduct or connections between elected officials that includes but is not limited to:

- (1) The knowledge that Plaintiff Dees and Sheriff Stallman are known to be close friends with Judge Greg Hill; (See Exhibit F)
- (2) Acknowledgement by local law enforcement that being seen as having any sort of public association with Kevin Henry is disadvantageous, particularly because of his current journalistic pursuits; (See Exhibit F)
- (3) The fact that Kevin Henry has already been treated egregiously by Judge Hill for his comments about Sheriff Stallman and Plaintiff Dees; (See Exhibit N)
- (4) Discussion about religious and civic leaders echoing messaging that discredits Plaintiff Henry, and using their entrenched influence to act in concert with political and media figures to foster an environment of coordinated suppression and reputational harm to Kevin Henry; (See Exhibit M)
- (5) A social media smear campaign seeking to frame Kevin Henry as dishonest and disruptive, and the perception that publicly posted statements suggest a coordinated retaliation against Kevin Henry; (See Exhibits O and P).
- (6) Photos of an "annual Gentlemen's Dinner" where the attendees appear to include Judge Greg Hill and Sheriff Bo Stallman; (See Exhibit P)
- (7) The same photo showing another attendee of the "annual Gentlemen's Dinner" to include a is prominent Brazoria County resident Ken Jo Kelly, whose daughter, Allysa Jordan has posted extensively and contemptuously about Defendant Henry on her personal social media page, including posting an AI generated video of Kevin Henry being shot in the head; (See Exhibit P).

This combination is further supported by the commentary from Judge Hill himself reacting both to his incarceration of Kevin Henry and Henry's release from custody. Per the affidavit of Sweeney Police Department Chief of Police Brad Caudle, Judge Greg Hill made the statement that it was a "good day of justice" when Defendant Kevin Henry was remanded to the custody of the Brazoria County Sheriff's Department (and Sheriff Stallman) on September 23, 2025 after being held in contempt for postings on social media. (*See* Exhibit F). Additionally, on September 26,

2026, when Kevin Henry was released from Jail, reporter Micheal Morris reported Judge Greg Hill's comment on the matter, which reads: "Orders from a state district judge are not to be flouted. Either you follow it or you go to jail." (*See* Exhibit E).

It is further important to note that the article discussed above, by reporter Michael Morris, focuses primarily on the allegations made in the Plaintiff's Original Petition, but does not appear to have reached out to Kevin Henry or the undersigned counsel for comment. (*See* Exhibit E). There is a "pattern of negative coverage targeting Mr. Henry in The Facts newspaper" in a manner that "undermines Kevin Henry's Credibility" and "shapes public perception in Brazoria County." (*See* Exhibit O).

Finally, restricting a litigant's freedom of liberty – especially in a civil case – is a very serious action, and one typically utilized only when absolutely necessary. Here, the intended effect was clearly punitive given that the social media posts in question had already been taken down and the purported harm to Plaintiff was objectively no longer possible. Even if there was still evidence of noncompliance – which there was not – many other less restrictive methods of ensuring a party's continued compliance with a court order exist – including fines, attorney's fees, and other sanctions. Yet, with no imminent threat to Plaintiff's person or property, Judge Greg Hill tossed Kevin Henry in jail.

Members of the judiciary have a duty to avoid the appearance of impropriety in all activities, pursuant to Cannon 2 of the Texas Code of Judicial Conduct. A judge is required to act at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the integrity and impartiality of the judiciary. Judges shall also not allow any relationship to influence judicial conduct or judgment. Certainly, holding one of the loudest critics (Kevin Henry) of a friend (Sheriff Stallman) in contempt of court and ordering him incarcerated for a month cannot comply with those Cannons,

and in fact operates as further evidence of the combination instigated by influential persons that

Kevin Henry now faces in Brazoria County.

III. <u>Conclusion</u>

Brazoria County Defendant, Kevin Henry, is one of the loudest critics of the kind of

political power brokering plaguing Brazoria County and the officials complicit in it. As such,

Defendant Kevin Henry will not have access to a fair trial. The influence of Plaintiff and his

political allies is far too vast and certainly stands to taint the decision making of any trier of fact.

Sufficient evidence exists that there is a combination of influential persons instigated against Kevin

Henry, by reason of which he cannot expect a fair trial.

For the foregoing reasons, it is clear that Brazoria County is not a proper venue for this

litigation.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Defendant, Kevin Henry, respectfully

requests that the Court transfer the venue of this litigation and grant any other relief to which he

may be entitled by law or by equity.








R. App. P. 52.8(b)(3). This order will remain in effect until the case in this Court is finally decided or until further order from this Court.

It is further **ordered** that the real party in interest Derrick Dees shall have <u>5</u> days from the date of this order to file a response brief, if any. *See id.* 52.4, 52.8(b)(1).

Relator's reply, if any, to the real party in interest's response, shall be due <u>no</u> <u>later than 3 days from the filing of the response</u>. *See id*. 52.5.

It is so **ORDERED**.

Appellate court orders bond on emergency petition

Henry released from jail

ANGLETON — Kevin Henry, jailed for violating a court order in a civil case, has been released on \$1,000 bond after an appellate court ruled in his favor Friday afternoon.

The decision by First Court of Appeals Chief Justice Terry Adams came after initial appeals on Henry's emergency petition for relief were rejected by the 14th Court of Appeals and Texas Supreme Court, online court records show.

Brazoria County District Judge Greg Hill ordered Henry to spend 30 days in the Brazoria County jail Tuesday for violating a temporary restraining order in a civil lawsuit filed by Angleton businessman Derrick Dees.

Ad removed. Details

Henry, a former sheriff's candidate and podcaster, quickly filed for relief in the appellate courts, arguing Hill's order violated Henry's due process and First Amendment rights and that the initial restraining order on which Hill based his punishment was invalid, according to a filing by attorney Jeffrey Nolan Diamant on Henry's behalf.

The 14th Court of Appeals rejected the petition Wednesday, with the Texas Supreme Court following suit Thursday and sending it back to the appellate level, online records show.

Adams wrote in his decision the court is "of the tentative opinion" that Henry is entitled to the legal relief sought "or that a serious question concerning that relief requires further consideration."

"We grant relator's emergency request for release from custody," Adams wrote in his decision.

Adams ordered the Brazoria County Sheriff's Office to release Henry on \$1,000 bond, and Hill issued the docket entry to facilitate it.

Dees will have five days to file a brief in response to Henry's petition, after which Henry will have three days to counter Dees' filing. A status hearing in the First Court of Appeals is scheduled for Oct. 10.

Hill found Henry violated a temporary restraining order signed Sept. 10 by Judge Jessica Pulcher in a civil lawsuit filed by Dees. The order required Henry to remove Sept. 6 and April 5 posts on his Facebook accounts immediately, which he failed to do.

"Orders from a state district judge are not to be flouted. Either you follow it or you go to jail," Hill said.

In his lawsuit claiming defamation and libel, Dees claims economic and reputational injury by Henry and co-defendant Brittney Robertson. The lawsuit claims Henry and Robertson conspired to spread false information against Dees as part of a campaign against Brazoria County Sheriff Bo Stallman, against whom Henry ran as an independent candidate in the Nov. 8 election. Dees is a longtime friend of Stallman and major supporter of the sheriff's reelection campaign, the lawsuit states.

The Sept. 6 post to the Kevin Henry Podcast social media account, removed this week, explicitly names Dees and infers wrongdoing by the businessman, according to the suit.

Henry suggested in another post that Dees had interfered in an investigation into Henry's claims against Stallman and that Dees was involved in "nefarious, and possibly criminal, conduct," knowing the allegations to be false, the lawsuit claims.


- 3. I have known Kevin Henry since he was a young child. I worked with his stepfather during my career in law enforcement. Kevin Henry has asked for my resignation publicly on his podcast.

Based on my tenure in the county and my tenure in law enforcement in the county, it is my personal belief that a combination exists against Kevin Henry that includes, but is not limited to, Sheriff Bo Stallman, Derrick Dees, Angela Dees, Judge Greg Hill, and other Judges in Brazoria County. Derrick Dees and Sheriff Bo Stallman are known to be close friends with Judge Hill. It is my personal belief that there exists circumstances, such as relationships, that would lead any person, including myself, to believe that the potential could exist to want to silence or cause harm to Kevin Henry for his attempts to expose what he believes to be corruption in Brazoria County. This belief is further emphasized by my understanding that Judge Greg Hill has made a statement that it was "a good day of justice" when Defendant Kevin Henry was placed in custody on September 23, 2025.
- 5. Part of my belief derives from the fact that Kevin Henry has continued to be very outspoken on what he believes to be corruption in Brazoria County that potentially implicates people included in the personal combination explained above. Another part of my personal belief derives from the fact that he is generally disliked by people working in the Brazoria County judicial system. For example, Kevin Henry once asked me to take a reserve position for him, but I refused because I knew it would be disadvantageous to the Sweeny police department for me to publicly associate with Kevin Henry, especially given his current journalistic pursuits.
- 6. Based on my tenure in the county, my tenure in law enforcement in the county, and my knowledge of the bureaucracy of the county, it is also my personal belief that there is

I. AWARENESS OF REPORTING

3. I am aware that Kevin Henry has publicly reported alleged misconduct by Brazoria County officials, including:

- a. An incident involving Sheriff Bo Stallman allegedly exposing himself to a nurse and Kevin Henry speaking about it at the Brazoria County Commissioner's Meeting.
- b. Allegations of election rigging and manipulation targeting Shane Green, the Brazoria County Republican Party Chair and others. (*Episode 13*)

II. PUBLIC RETALIATION AND MEDIA BIAS

4. I have observed a pattern of retaliation against Mr. Henry, including the following:

a. Brazoria County Republican Party (BCRP):

i. Passed Resolution 2021-R-2, which explicitly which explicitly discourages support for dissenting voices and threatens censure for those who do. The resolution mandates exclusive support for Republican candidates and explicitly threatens censure of any Republican who supports a Democrat or dissenting figure. Kevin Henry, as a whistleblower and independent candidate, is politically delegitimized by this resolution. This creates a chilling effect on potential witnesses, precinct chairs, and officials who might otherwise support or testify on his behalf. b. The Facts Newspaper:

i. I have observed a pattern of negative coverage targeting Mr. Henry in The Facts newspaper. The Facts is part of a coordinated media influence campaign that undermines Kevin Henry's credibility and shapes public perception in Brazoria County. - 1. My name is James Beadel. I am over the age of twenty-one (21), have never been convicted of a felony or crime or moral turpitude, and am fully competent to make this affidavit. I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this affidavit.
- 2. I am a resident of Brazoria County, Texas, and have lived in this community for several years. I am familiar with the political, civic, and educational dynamics that shape public affairs in this county

I. AWARENESS OF KEVIN HENRY'S REPORTING AND RETALIATION

3. I am aware that Kevin Henry, through Texpose Media and his podcast, has publicly reported on:

- a. Alleged misconduct by Sheriff Bo Stallman, including an incident involving inappropriate exposure to a nurse. (*Episode 17*)
- b. Claims of election interference involving Shane Green, Brazoria County Republican Party Chair. (*Episode 13*)
- 4. Mr. Henry has faced legal retaliation, public ridicule, and personal attacks, all this amounts to retaliation for informing the public.

II. INFLUENCE OF BUSINESS OWNERS, DONORS, AND POLITICAL SUPPORTERS

- 5. I have personally observed and am aware of instances where:
 - a. Civic leaders, including Chamber of Commerce affiliates and local club officials, who have echoed partisan messaging and undermined Mr. Henry's credibility. (See Exhibit A)
 - b. Donors and political supporters who have exerted pressure on elected officials, courts, and agencies to pursue outcomes favorable to their interests and hostile to Mr. Henry. (See Exhibit B, C, D).
- 6. This influence is often exerted through campaign contributions, public endorsements, social media posts, non-profits and behind-the-scenes communications that are not disclosed to the public.

III. MEDIA REINFORCEMENT AND PUBLIC BIAS

7. I have observed that The Facts newspaper, under the editorial leadership of Yvonne Mintz, has published more than 20 articles that appear to target Mr. Henry. These pieces often lack balanced context and reinforce narratives aligned with the officials and institutions Mr. Henry has exposed

IV. CONCERN REGARDING IMPARTIAL PROCEEDINGS

- 8. Given the pervasive influence of these interconnected groups—political, civic, educational, and media—I do not believe Mr. Henry can receive a fair and impartial trial in Brazoria County. The environment is one of entrenched bias, coordinated retaliation, and institutional suppression.
- 9. It is also my personal belief that there is a combination against Kevin Henry instigated by influential persons, by reason of which he cannot expect to have a fair and impartial trial in Brazoria County.







AFFIDAVIT OF KEVIN HENRY

BEFORE ME, the undersigned notary public, personally appeared as Kevin Henry, who, after being duly sworn, deposed, and stated as follows:

- 1. My name is Kevin Henry, I am over the age of twenty one (21), have never been convicted of a felony or crime or moral turpitude, and am fully competent to make this affidavit. I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this affidavit.
- 2. I am a journalist and former independent candidate for Brazoria County Sheriff. Through my investigative journalist work with Texposé Media, I have publicly disclosed alleged misconduct by Brazoria County officials, including incidents involving Sheriff Bo Stallman.

I. RETALIATION AND SUPPRESSION

3. Following my disclosures, I have been subjected to repeated retaliation, including:

- a. A defamation lawsuit filed by Derrick Dees, a political ally of Sheriff Stallman and spouse of the Brazoria County Treasurer, Angela Dees. (Case No. 136646-CV)
- b. Charged with contempt and jailed for protected speech. (Sept. 23, 2025
- c. A civil suit filed by the Brazoria County District Attorney's Office against the Texas Attorney General concerning a public-records request in Brazoria County (Case No. D-1-GN-25-008014).

II. DANGEROUS COMBINATION OF INFLUENTIAL PERSONS

- 4. I believe there exists a dangerous combination against me instigated by influential persons, including:
 - a. Commissioner Pct. 2 Ryan Cade, who holds budgetary and political influence over county operations. Ryan Cade was the subject of my reporting involving harboring an illegal immigrant and using his political influence to circumvent the ICE detainer process at the Brazoria County Detention Center. (Episode 11)
 - b. Sheriff Bo Stallman was the subject of my reporting after allegedly exposing himself to a nurse at a clinic as per the clinic owner(s) and a documented police report. (APD Report No. 2004-002500) (Episode 17)
 - c. Texas Ranger, Aaron Arizmendi, who leaked information that was used to preemptively discredit me and used to coordinate legal retaliation. He made threats of taking me out after disclosing his relationship with Kenneth Jo "Kenjo" Kelley, a convicted felon and Sheriff Bo Stallman donor. (January 2025)
- d. Derrick Dees, who filed a defamation suit in coordination with the above officials.

 (Case No.136646-CV)

e. 239th District Judge Greg Hill and other judicial officers, who have refused to recuse themselves despite clear conflicts of interest. (Case No.136646-CV)

f. The Facts, Southern Newspapers Inc., Yvonne Mintz Editor & Publisher, has published over 23 negative articles targeting me, omitting key context and amplifying official narratives. This coverage has shaped public perception and prejudiced potential jury pools. (Dec 2023-Sept 2025)

III. IMPACT ON FAIR TRIAL

5. Due to the coordinated actions of these individuals, It is my personal belief that I cannot expect to obtain a fair and impartial trial in Brazoria County. Their influence over law enforcement, judicial proceedings, and public perception has created an environment of bias, suppression, and retaliation.

6. It is also my personal belief that there is a combination against myself instigated by influential persons, by reason of which he cannot expect to have a fair and impartial trial in Brazoria County. It is my personal belief that part of this combination includes Sheriff Bo Stallman, Judge Greg Hill, Derrick Dees, Angela Dees, and Ken Jo Kelly, and other Judges in Brazoria County.
